CDT CODE ADDITIONS, REVISIONS & DELETIONS
DELTA DENTAL OF KANSAS (DDKS) PROCESSING POLICY CHANGES

The American Dental Association (ADA) published the new procedure codes set for 2020. To order, contact the ADA at 800.947.4746 or visit adacatalog.org. Changes in the CDT 2020 include: **37 new codes, 6 deleted codes, 5 revised nomenclatures/descriptors and 15 editorial (e.g. syntax; spelling) actions that clarify without changing the CDT code entry's purpose or scope.** The Code on Dental Procedures and Nomenclature is the national standard for reporting dental services and serves as the HIPAA standard code set. Any claim submitted electronically or on paper must use procedure codes from the current version of the CDT manual.

- The listing of a procedure code does not mean that the procedure code is a covered or reimbursable benefit in a dental benefits plan.
- It is the responsibility of the patient, not the dental office, to know what is covered and what is excluded from the group's dental plan. The dentist should treat the patient and not the insurance coverage. Predeterminations are encouraged.
